EARLY DISMISSAL

NURSE SHOTS

What the School Nurse wants you to know: Make 2010 a year to make health a resolution. Take steps everyday to live a safe and healthy life.

THE BUS: Of all the vehicles that travel on our nation's highways, none are safer than the school bus, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). But that doesn't mean school busses don't have risks all their own.

The most dangerous part of the school bus ride for a student is not actually the time spent on the bus, but getting off and on the bus reports NHTSA.

This "danger zone" accounts for about three times as many school bus-related deaths as the ride itself does, even though there are more non-fatal injuries during the ride than there are during the loading and unloading of students.

Serious injuries during loading and unloading can occur when children: Are in a hurry getting off and on the bus, don't pay attention to surrounding traffic or move out of the bus driver's site.

To avoid these potential dangers, teach your child to make safe habits a priority by teaching them to take the following simple yet potentially life-saving precautions: Walk to and from the bus with a friend or family member. Get to the bus stop early so you don't have to hurry. Never move toward the bus until it has come to a complete stop, the door has opened and its safety lights are flashing. Never cross a street without checking both ways for traffic, looking left, then right, then left again. Always stay within the bus driver's view. Walk in front of the bus only. If you drop something around the bus, tell the driver. Don't try to pick it up until the driver knows you've dropped something. Never move around on the bus. Take a seat and stay there. If the bus has seat belts, always wear one. Obey the driver and speak quietly so the driver can concentrate. Never stick anything out the bus window.
